DEWEY'S SCIENTIFIC METHOD

2. Determine the hypothesis or reason why the problem exists
3. Collect and analyze data
4. Formulate conclusions
5. Apply conclusion to the original hypothesis

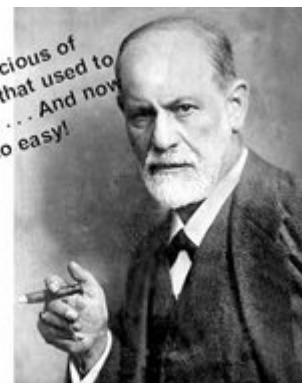
How do we do this?
