

2023 SNAPSHOT









Spencer Research Library

- 745 in-person researchers visited the Reading Room
 - (50% KU undergrad/grad students)
- 87 tours & events for campus, K-12, community, national, & international groups
- 128 instruction sessions led for KU classes, reaching more than 1,300 students

Conservation Services

- 2,786 items repaired in-house
- 305 audio, video, and film digitized
- 290 visitors to the conservation lab, including KU students, K-12 students, & community

International Collections

- Approx. 1.5M items in non-English languages
 - (Approx. 25% of KU's 5.78M print collection)
- KU Libraries collections span almost 400 languages!





- Dardess Research Forum for faculty and graduate students (East Asian)










Digitization & Born Digital: Team Effort

Digital Initiatives

- Digitally publish 56 open journals (*soon to be 57!) / 1,054,494 downloads (CY23)
- KU ScholarWorks: 29,111 items, including 9,544 KU theses & dissertations
 - **2,115,500 downloads** (CY23)
- Almost 200,000 objects with 500,000+ views (2018+) in Digital Collections Repository

Research & Learning

- 95 systematic review consultations/meetings for 13 depts. & research centers
- 260 systematic reviews by 420 authors published to Covidence platform
- More than 350 library instruction sessions led (AY22-23)

Collections Strategy & Development

- 85% of collections budget devoted to electronic resources.
 - Elsevier titles comprise 15% of collections budget
- 154 open access articles by KU researchers published via APC waivers/discounts

Scholarly Communication & Copyright

- Open Educational Resources OER initiatives: 38 awards / \$129,252 awarded
 - Estimated \$1,167,200 cost savings annually for 11,592 individual students

- Data Carpentries Genomics
 - Hosted workshops for 35 learners, teaching data management and analysis skills

Student engagement

- Makerspace:
 - Events included Plantshootz from Anschutz where over 200 people got a baby plant and contributed to ideas for future programming and activities.
- "De-Stress Study Sesh"
 - November event to help students prepare for finals in collaboration with the KU
 Writing Center (Wingspan: Center for Learning & Writing Support)
- "Watch it at Watson"
 - First ever movie night during Hawk Week with a screening of "The Hunger Games" (67 students attended)



Expanding content

- Collections Strategy & Development: 653 requests from users → purchases via "Suggest a Purchase" form
- 11,000+ films in streaming collections with the addition of Swank 1,000 and Kanopy's new subscription project, K-Base

Advocating for open

- KU joined HELIOS Open, a network of higher education institutions working together to advance open knowledge production and practices with a focus on engaging with senior decision makers
- Worked with two editors of 5 journals to flip from closed to open, as well as hosting community-building Editors Forums
- KU Libraries expanded open access publishing by signing partnerships with 6
 different publishers that eliminate APCs for KU researchers

Acquisitions & Resource Sharing

- 15,365 KU items loaned to other institutions (FY23)
- 8,336 items borrowed from other institutions (FY23)
- 11,532 new monographs (print & electronic) acquired, up 6% from 2022
- 46 new databases (or database components) & 5 new journals added, up 2% from 2022

Cataloging & Archival Processing

- 117,901 print books & e-books processed & added to online catalog (FY23)
- 566,072 new & corrected name and subject authority records loaded into Voyager
- 100s of Library of Congress historically-inappropriate or obsolete subject headings remediated
- 132,283 items from 5 on-campus libraries prepared for accessioning into the Annex (FY23)

Library Annex

• 173,304 items accessioned (CY23), and 2,447,340 total items accessioned (as of 3/11/24)

Access Services & Space Usage

- 62,011 items circulated (FY23)
- 535,257 users visits to all library locations over 135 hours per week (CY23)
- 4,307 different students reserved study rooms via 25,571 booking slots (CY23)

Employee environments

- Refreshed furnishings in Acquisitions, providing adjustable-height workstations and task lighting for staff and students
- Refreshed staff offices in Anschutz Library
- Completed upgrades to the Library Administrative Office, partnering with the Office of Communications & Advancement in advance of the space's naming as the Ranz Administrative Suite



Welcoming & engaging spaces

- New building entrance doors installed in Watson and Spencer to enhance environmental controls and improve security
- Two locations added activity tables near lobby seating for de-stressing and brain breaks
- Operations Managers began decorating service points to be more welcoming

- Finalized 5 new Read and Publish agreements
 - Elsevier, Company of Biologists, Cambridge R&P, Frontiers, PeerJ
- ADA review of new online resource requests implemented
- Open Access (OA) fund reporting operationalized

Cataloging & Archival Processing

- Completed our serial archive building commitment to WEST (West Regional Storage Trust)
 - KU has participated in this distributed print serial repository program since 2011
- Provided a selection of our records to new shared catalogs:
 - Universal Short Title Catalogue (USTC): provided bibliographic information for 14,434 items
 - Consortium for History of Science, Technology & Medicine: provided 247,258 MARC records (all Spencer holdings, including those in the Annex)
- Inventoried & preserved historic Cornish Studios glass plate negatives through Ringle internship
- Rehoused John Gould Ornithological Collection and worked with Digital Initiatives to better preserve
- Prioritized processing workflows: African American Experience Collection and BIPOC new acquisitions, as well as materials for instruction or public use/exhibitions


Welcoming & engaging spaces

 - Beaham Reading Room refreshed with all new furniture
 - Opened all of 2 South as a user study environment
 - New service desk
- Music & Dance Library:
 - Underwent a public furniture refresh with a variety of new public seating
 - Introduced a new **display and exhibit space** to highlight collections
- Art & Architecture Library:
 - Developed **two new exhibits a year** to highlight the closed stacks collections

Community hub

- LibArt program: student art exhibition
 - **Highest annual submissions** of student artwork for display across library locations
 - Inaugural monetary awards presented to LibArt student artists
- **Upgraded A/V technology** in Watson 3 West and Spencer's Johnson Room and North Gallery to support expanded **events/conference opportunities**
- Watson 3 West & 455 have become very popular campus meeting spaces



Watson Library...Turns 100 in 2024!

- Last major renovation: 1978-82
- Fully embody and advance Jayhawks
 Rising "Research & Discovery"
- Vision includes visible colocation of R&D initiatives; flexible event spaces; new centers for business research & global librarianship; digitization lab; scholarly makerspaces; integrated, interactive digital technologies; and more
- Seeking major capital campaign for <u>full</u> renovation (\$100M+), centering on expanded accessibility, sustainability, inviting, flexible indoor & outdoor research and learning spaces

Anschutz Library

- Major gathering place & campus crossroads for undergraduates
- Fully embody and advance Jayhawks Rising "Student Success"
- Pressing need for Student Success Center
- Vision includes full-service café with adjoining faculty lounge, library instruction space, expanded student success space, more student study space (solo + group); expanded makerspaces
- Seeking a program plan to guide phased renovation over time

Library Annex

- Fundamental to opening up student-centered space in both Watson and Anschutz
- Will reach capacity in 3-5 years
 (*must break ground in 1 year)
- Approx. **\$16M+ project**



Amplify researcher impact through expertise, community, and diverse resources that **propel knowledge creation and sharing**.

Strategies:

V. Apply new methods to assess, strengthen, and streamline library decision-making, workflows, and processes.


Major Strategic Initiatives: Healthy & Vibrant Communities
